
## **Key Facts**

- Fairtrade is a way of buying and selling products that allows the farmers to be paid a fair price for their produce and have better working conditions.
- Common Fairtrade foods include:
  - Fruits bananas, mangoes, pineapples and grapefruit
  - Chocolate
  - Tea and Coffee
  - ♦ Sugar
  - Honey

- **Temperate Climate** A place with a temperate climate has warm summers and cool winters. The UK has this kind of • climate.
