- They should bring a labelled water bottle from home.




Attendance and Punctuality


- It is vital that children come to school every day and on time.

Attendance and Punctuality

- We aim for all children to achieve attendance at 96% or above.
- If attendance drops below this learning will suffer.
- If children do not attend school regularly, they may not be able to keep up with the learning. Children only get one chance at school, and a child's chance of a successful future may be affected by not attending school regularly.
- Punctuality is important-even 1 minute late is late!!

Reading



Word	Definition
backbone	An external supporting structure, such as the shell of a crustacean.
classify	The row of bones that runs along the centre of the back—spine.
exoskeleton	A warm-blooded animal with fur or hair on its skin and a skeleton inside its body. The mothers produce milk to feed their babies.
invertebrate	The inner framework of bones and cartilage in vertebrate animals. This supports the body and protect softer body parts.
mammal	Animals with backbones as part of an internal skeleton .
skeleton	Animals that do not have an internal skeleton.
vertebrate	Assigning an item to a group based on common characteristics.

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
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In addition please make sure your children are checking Google classrooms daily as learning and any notices will be put on there also.
