Welcome to Year 2!

We hope you have had a restful break and are ready for the next half of this term. There is a lot to do this half term, so we hope this letter will enable you to support your child with their learning at home.

English

In Literacy we will begin the term with the story Snow White in New York. This is a modern version of the fairy tale, Snow White and the Seven Dwarves. Children will be comparing the main characters from the two stories before writing setting and character descriptions.

Later this term, children will different features of poetry such as onomatopoeia, repetition, alliterations, rhyme. They will continue to develop their spelling, handwriting and punctuation skills through a range of written tasks including letter writing and retelling familiar stories.

Maths

This term's maths learning will develop children's understanding of the addition and subtraction of one and two-digit numbers. Children will use pictures, objects and number lines to help them. After that, children will be multiplying and dividing using arrays and further develop strategies for multiplication. Children will also further develop number fluency including halving, doubling and number bonds.

By the end of Year 2, children will need to know and remember **2, 3, 5 and 10 multiplication facts.** They need to recall these at speed and learn the division facts to go with them. Please support your child to learn these times tables. Children have access to <u>Times Tables Rockstars</u> so should be using this to help their learning.

Music

Children will learn songs, play instruments and learning about musical terms such as beat, rhythm, pitch, high and low.

Religion and World Views

The children will become acquainted with worn symbols of belonging in different religions (Cross, Tallit, Kippah, 5K's in Sikhism) and begin to identify the meaning of these symbolic items.

Science

This half term our new topic will be 'Materials'. Children will build on their knowledge from Year 1 and investigate how we use them and how to re-use materials for different purposes. Children will use scientific vocabulary to describe the properties of materials. You can support your child by helping them to recognise what different materials there are around your house, and how to recycle them to make different objects. The knowledge organisers for this topic are on our website.

Computing - Robot algorithms

Children will develop their understanding of simple programming – giving instructions and predicting what will happen. They will use given commands in different orders to investigate how the order affects the outcome. Children will also design algorithms and then test those algorithms.

<u>Art</u>

Children will earn how to create art using the properties of line, tone, colour, texture, pattern, shape and form.

Recognise when they are using these qualities and can describe what they are doing.

History

Children will learn how school is different to schools from 100 years ago. Children will compare schools in the present to the past.

Children will examine a range of sources to understand what schools were like in the past. They will also identify three features of a classroom now and a classroom 100 years ago, identifying some similarities and differences.

P.E

In P.E. children will be focussing on balance and agility. They will be participating in activities using mirror games, balancing activities and peer group challenges. Children will be encouraged to use their social skills to aid them in group tasks.

PSHE

They will also learn that we all have similarities and differences and that we should still accept and respect one another.

Week 3: Write a sentence for each of the following conjunctions: and, because and but.

Week 4: Use adjectives to describe your local area.

Week 5: Count forwards in 10s from these numbers: 22, 38 and 52.

Week 6: Count backwards in 10s from these numbers: 95, 86 and 61.
